For the third time this weekend, Hurley lost the toss and were condemned to chase leather in the sweltering heat. With little in favour of the bowlers, it was no surprise that a match consisting of 485 runs for the loss of only six wickets ended in a draw.

Strollers' openers Jono Addis (83) and Mike Loan (111*) enjoyed an opening partnership of 140 as all the Hurley bowlers were put under the cosh. With no chances coming the way of the fielders it was a surprise when Addis feathered an

edge off left arm seamer Mark Allen which was gratefully accepted by Mike Walton behind the wicket. The loss of his opening partner did not deter Loan, who together with Blair Travis (51) added another century partnership in fourteen overs. Travis eventually fell to the Walton double act, giving Dave the charge and suffering the same fate as many who have gone before him. With 268 on the board, Addis called his troops in, much to the relief of the wilting fielders. Strollers sportingly allowed Pat Hinnell to bat instead of Mo Basharat who had to leave early and Hurley sent the veteran out to open the innings with Imran Mazood as a pinch hitter. Having hit his third delivery down the ground for a maximum, Mazood then stepped out of his crease chasing a wide, seemingly oblivious to the fact that the keeper was up to the stumps and suffered the inevitable consequence. Yasir Gul (1) got himself run out and Andleeb Imran tried a massive heave, losing his off stump to Pete Wood. At 18 for 3 a familiar Hurley collapse looked on the cards. This was averted as Josh Cole set a career best 74 in a partnership of 104 with Hinnell to steady the Hurley ship. Cole looked to be in no trouble and easing towards a century when he edged a delivery from Simon Brodbeck on to his stumps. At 126 for 4 Strollers' sensed a chance to force a victory but with the resolute Hinnell joined by Hurley's leading batsman Phil Ridgeway, it was not to be. Ridgeway reached a deserved half-century and Hinnell finished on 45*, a mammoth effort for the 68 year old in the tropical conditions, as the match ended with Hurley on 217 for 4 and honours even.
