Hurley 2nd XI ended their Marrant Chilterns League season with a comprehensive victory over The Lee at Shepherds Lane. On winning the toss Mike Walton opted to bat first, opening the innings together with Shoaib Kayani. The opening pair made steady progress against The Lee opening attack of Ollie Cupit and Jordan Essex. The partnership had reached 52 in the fifteenth over when Kayani played all round an in-swinging delivery from Cupit. Yasir Gul and Walton have been the mainstay of the Hurley batting line up this season and today was no different as both batsmen made half centuries, adding 93 for the second wicket. Having reached his fifty, Gul lofted Charlie Line to Cupit. Abdul Jabbar made a brisk 21 before holing out to give Line his second wicket. Fayyaz Kayani joined the skipper and upped the scoring rate with his usual flurry of boundaries. Rain forced the players

from the field and an early tea was taken with Hurley on 210 for 3 from 38 overs. Eight overs were lost to the rain and on the resumption the Hurley batsmen looked for quick runs, pushing the score to 245 in the forty-second over before the loss of Kayani (45) prompted the declaration with Walton undefeated on 61.

Hurley opened the bowling with debutant John Munday and Nigel Haines utilising the old ball. Munday struggled to find his length with his first over going for 28 runs for the wicket of Attley. After six overs of spin, the new ball was taken by Amaan Mahmood and Fayyaz Kayani. Kayani made the breakthrough, dismissing the dangerous Mike Harris, chipping to Usman at short mid-wicket. (91-2) Usman replaced Mahmood and swung the ball to good effect, having Cooper caught behind and removing Mike Stark's leg stump. Another wicket for Kayani had the visitors at 141 for 5 with 21 overs remaining. Jack Stark and Jordan Essex kept The Lee in the game with a gutsy partnership of 25 for the sixth wicket but the introduction Raheem Dad turned the match in Hurley's favour with 2 for 10 from five overs. Kayani returned to mop up the tail, dismissing Sharman (1), Sam Harris (0) and Cupit (2) to claim a 'five for' and give Hurley a resounding victory to finish the season.
