The Hurley Sunday XI got their season off to a winning start with a convincing victory against Luddites. The hosts won the toss and opted to bat first and despite losing Shoaib Kayani to a sharp catch off Dehal in the fourth over went on to post a formidable total. An Oscar winning performance by Mubashir Nabi with 51 from 40 deliveries kept the crowd entertained as he smashed the ball to all parts. Best supporting actor was claimed by Mike Cole with a measured 58 from 57. Oscar (Mr) Bean chipped in with 42 from 30 balls and a

last wicket partnership of 25 between Mike Walton (24) and Mo Basharat (12*) saw Hurley to a total of 253 all out in 38 overs. After a DIY, Covid safe tea, Luddites set about the ominous task in front of them. Hamzah Zaman (3-12) and Krish Kota (1-14) proved a handful for the opening pair of Dehal and Greenacre. Both bowlers swung the ball and the skiddy pace of Kota made run scoring difficult. The score had only reached 8 in the fourth over when Greenacre shouldered arms to a swinging full-toss from Kota which thudded into the batsman's pad giving the umpire an easy decision. Not to be outdone, Zaman demolished Maunder's timbers in the seventh over leaving the visitors floundering at 14 for 2. The Oakleys staged a mini recovery with 20 runs in 11 overs but with the required rate approaching double figure the match was effectively over as a contest. Bean's pace proved too hot to handle for most of the batsmen and when he was replaced by Scott Taylor the score quickly became 41 for 4 thanks to a juggled catch at mid-off by Kayani to dismiss Dehal. Liam Cole with 1 for 22 from his eight over spell bowled some tidy off-spin. Zaman returned to claim another 2 wickets and with light fading Josh Cole was given the chance to turn his arm over, striking with his first delivery as Musgrave edged to slip where Mike Cole held onto a sharp chance. This was the last meaningful action as the Luddites' innings finished on 143 for 7.
