Due to overnight rain and a showery morning, play was only possible at Shepherds Lane due to the Herculean efforts of Hurley groundsman Jeff Dawson and a willing band of helpers. A new wicket was prepared and play eventually got under way at 2pm in bright sunshine. The visitors won a vital toss and predictably asked Hurley to bat first. Pav Hunjan (57) and Mike Walton (13) struggled to get the ball away as the damp pitch made stroke play a hazardous endeavour. With a shortened match of 80 overs available, a score of around 150 would have set a challenging target. By the drinks break, Hurley had reached forty without loss, setting the base for an acceleration. The first over after the resumption set the tone, as some aerial shots from Hunjan and quick running between the wickets saw nine runs taken from the over. Walton paid the price for trying to force the pace, caught behind by the squeaky voiced, thirteen year old, Joe Thomas off Walters. Hunjan fell to a good catch in the deep by Young off left arm spinner Paul Michaels. Hurley shuffled their batting order, promoting the big hitters up the order and the run rate crept up, reaching 98 for 5 in the thirty-first over when a sudden down pour sent the players hurrying to the pavilion. An early tea was taken and despite bright sunshine reappearing the puddles on the square meant play was abandoned for the day.
