Local rivals Crazies Hill provided the opposition for Hurley in a COVID adapted 36 over match at Shepherds Lane. The visitors won the toss and asked Hurley to bat first on a wicket affected by heavy overnight rain. After the first two deliveries reared off a length, the decision was made to switch to another strip which had remained covered after the abandonment of the previous day's league match. The new ball attack of Payne and McCook proved a good test for the Hurley openers Mike Cole and Yasir Gul, as well as the Crazies' wicket keeper Howard Newsome with byes the top scorer in the opening stand of 24. Cole could count himself a little unfortunate when the keeper hung on to a sharp chance off McCook. John Munday made a classy looking 27 in a fifty-run partnership for the second wicket. Josh Cole held the middle order together before perishing two runs short of a half-century in the final over. A procession of wickets with none of the last seven batsmen reaching double figures saw Hurley slump to 149 all out off the final ball of the innings.

In reply, Mo Basharat and Hamza Zamman kept a lid on proceedings for the first four overs but once Simpson and Tidswell got into their stride runs began to flow. The off side fielders were largely superfluous as both batsmen favoured the slog to leg as their primary option. A skilfully delivered quicker delivery from Liam Cole broke the opening partnership of 81 in the eleventh over. Simpson eventually retired hurt, having injured his back but Tett and Montgomery saw the visitors home in the nineteenth over.
