A tight finish at Shepherds Lane on Sunday saw the visitors claim victory with a couple of overs to spare. Hurley were hampered by a late withdrawal due to injury and had to take to the field with ten men. Mo Basharat won the toss and inserted The Wayfarers. Early breakthroughs by Basharat, thanks to catches by Yasir Gul, and Joban Singh saw the visitors tottering at 15 for 4. Sodah enjoyed a reprieve when adjudged leg-before to Basharat but was sportingly called back by the Hurley players after edging the ball onto his pad. Wright and Croft staged a recovery adding 45 for the fifth wicket before both falling to catches at slip by Nigel Wright off Liam Cole. Johnny Laxton (51) and Baron (36) ensured Wayfarers set a competitive target of 173.

The Hurley reply got off to the worst possible start, losing both openers, Hassan and Yasir Gul to Baron with only 5 on the board, the majority of which were extras. Only one more

was added before Jasdeep Singh was also sent back to the pavilion by Sam Withanage. Mubashir Nabi at least reached double figures before a loose drive saw him edge to slip. Joban Singh failed to move the scoreboard and when Mike Walton joined Ajmal Ali, the only hope Hurley had was to try and hang on for 23 overs for a draw. Ali and Walton ticked off the overs and had got it down to 9 remaining when Moffat had Ali caught behind off the gloves. Liam Cole entered the fray and together with Walton looked to be guiding their side to safety when Walton was adjudged leg before to Luke Pollard, the umpire failing to detect an inside edge. Pollard then had Nigel Haines well caught by Moffat at short cover, leaving skipper Basharat and Cole to see out the last three overs. Unfortunately for the hosts, Mike Ball got through Cole's solid defence with eleven balls remaining to give Wayfarers a victory which they thought might never come.
