A high scoring 35 over match at Nettlebed saw the hosts prevail but not without a fight from the Hurley batsman. The worst fielding display by a Hurley side in many years saw them concede 263 in 35 overs as Sam Butler (64) and Jason Vaughen-Davis (101) ran riot. The day started well for Hurley when the first ball of the match, sent down by Joban Singh, swung into left-handed Matt Butler and removed his leg stump. Omar soon followed, also bowled by Joban. Ollie Simmons and skipper Sam Butler staged a recovery with a partnership of 63. Kuljit Lally then removed both batsmen with stunning catches from Akash and Dimple. Three more quick wickets, two for Lally and a run-out by Joban reduced the hosts to 111 for 7. Joban returned to bowl Luke Davies, and it looked like Nettlebed would struggle to reach

150. However, Jason Vaughen-Davies had other ideas and launched a withering assault, scoring his hundred from 51 deliveries as the Hurley fielders wilted. Even after the centurion retired, there was little respite for the fielding side as Richard and Harry Graham added another 45 runs to take Nettlebed to a formidable total of 263.

Needing to score at 7.5 an over was a massive task for Hurley not made any easier by some tight bowling by Ollie Offwood and Tom Vockins. Openers Yasir (13) and Hassan (67) Gul posted fifty for the first wicket but took 14 overs to do so. When Yasir was caught at slip, Josh Cole looked to push the score along but holed out to mid-wicket off Harry Graham. This brought Archie Wild to the wicket and with the required rate above 12 an over there was only one option for the batsmen. Wild set about the bowling with gusto, reaching his half-century from 18 deliveries. At the other end Hassan Gul reached a maiden half-century before falling to Simmons. Joban Singh was pushed up the order to try and maintain the run rate, and the Nettlebed fielders suddenly became less boisterous as it looked like Hurley might have a chance of reaching the target. Unfortunately for the visitors, Wild fell to Matt Butler with 87 still needed from 6 overs. Dimple Singh fell to the next delivery and with the loss of Akash Singh (14) and Lally (0) the match was over as a contest. Joban (33*) and Mike Walton (3*) played out the last three overs, ensuring Hurley got past the 200 mark, eventually finishing 37 runs short.
