On the same day as a nail-biting and controversial finish to the second ashes test at Lords, Hurley Sunday XI enjoyed what was, ultimately, a straight-forward home victory over White Waltham.

With sunny skies above and an eye on Sky-Go, Skipper Shoaib Kayani won the toss and elected to bat on a hard but green-tinged wicket.

Gathered around a phone watching Ben Stokes hitting sixes like it was going out of fashion, the Hurley cohort was hopeful for a long first wicket stand from our openers. Alas, this was not to be. Club President Pat Hinnell pulled a muscle taking off for a lightning single in the second over and was unfortunately forced to retire hurt. Mubashir Nabi soon followed him back to the clubhouse - bowled by Pant, having got through his pull shot well before the ball

reached him. In came Hurley's home-grown talent in Archie Wild and Haider Ali, looking to steady the ship. Neither left their usual impression with the bat though, with Wild losing his leg stump for 12 and Ali chipping to midwicket for 3. Shoaib Kayani played a true captain's innings, rotating the strike and regularly putting away the bad ball for 95*. The skipper remained unfazed as wickets regularly fell around him, with Graham and Singh the only others to make double figures before both falling to rash shots. Some resolute blocking from Maz Nabi and Nigel Haines, as well as the valiant return of the injured Hinnell with the help of a runner, allowed Kayani to guide Hurley to 195-9.

In reply, number two Hayward saw his stumps splattered for a golden duck, falling to the immaculate line and length of Joban Singh. A flurry of runs followed from Jathavedan and Clarkin, before an in-swing from Graham accounted for Clarkin's leg-stump. Soon after, Jathavedan miscued a full toss from Graham, skying to mid-on where the catch was taken assuredly by Maz Nabi. Singh then bowled new batsman Ames for 1 in similar fashion to his first wicket, leaving the visitors 36-4. White Waltham looked to mount a fightback from here, but the following 27-run partnership between Weeks and Dhillon was eventually broken when Weeks hit a well-directed full toss from Maz Nabi to a diving Graham at extra cover. Wickets continued to fall regularly from this point. Archie Wild's youthful exuberance and ruthless chance-taking behind the stumps gave Hurley a clinical edge, taking a smart catch from the bowling of Ajmal Ali, as well as a stumping from the floating dynamite of Haines' left-arm spin. Veteran leg-spinner Steve Taylor finished with exceptional figures from his two overs of two wickets for just one run, to wrap up proceedings and bowl White Waltham out for 92.

A real team effort in the field and with the ball, as well as Kayani's heroics with the bat, gave the Hurley boys a well-earned and resounding 103-run victory.
