For the second week running, rain interrupted proceedings at Shepherds Lane. This week's visitors were Ruislip, making their first trip to Hurley. With the forecast looking poor, a 35 overs per side match was agreed on and on winning the toss the visitors opted to bat first.

Openers Sinnakone and Kapoor had reached 45 in the tenth over when rain forced the players from the pitch. An early tea was taken and once the rain cleared the match was reduced to 25 overs per side. With neither of the opening bowlers managing to make a breakthrough, Hurley turned to spin in the guise of Phil Ridgeway and Haider-Ali Baig. Ridgeway proved expensive, conceding 48 from his five overs, while Baig got the much-needed breakthrough, dismissing both openers. Youngsters Faisan Javed and Usmaan Zaman also chipped in with a couple of wickets apiece as the Ruislip middle order failed to impress.

An unbeaten eighth wicket partnership of 28 between Tam Morgan and Rahul Baghla ensured that Ruislip posted a competitive 161 from 25 overs, setting Hurley a DLS adjusted target of 178.

Young guns Archie Wild and Haider-Ali Baig were sent out to try and get Hurley off to a flying start, but Wild fell early for only 7 runs. Akash Singh joined Baig in a stand of 67 from 53 deliveries to put Hurley in contention. When Baig (35) fell at 81 for 2, Akashdeep Singh strolled to the middle and proceeded to batter the Ruislip attack all around the ground with 38 from 19 balls. Akash fell on 50 in the 15th over with the score on 124, leaving his side needing less than a run a ball from the last ten overs. Hamzah Zaman (0), Joban Singh (4) and Nabi (3) all fell cheaply as Baghla and Tenahandi ripped through the middle order, leaving Ridgeway to bat with the youngsters and try and see Hurley home. Tight overs from Tam and Tuvshen Morgan, left the hosts needing 14 from the final over which skipper Sinnakone took the option to bowl himself. The first three balls produced no runs as singles were turned down to keep Ridgeway on strike. The fourth ball soared over the mid-wicket boundary for a maximum, eight required from two. The next delivery saw Javed run out going for a second to get Ridgeway back on strike, now needing a six to tie the match off the last delivery. A pull shot from Ridgeway looked to be heading over the boundary, only to be caught by Matt Dix, to give Ruislip a thrilling victory off the last ball of the 2023 season at Shepherds Lane.
