Summer finally returned to Shepherds Lane on Sunday as Peppard Stoke Row provided the opposition for a 35 overs per side friendly.

Hurley won the toss and opted to bat first in the balmy conditions, opening with Josh Cole and Farhan Hussain. After hitting the first ball of the match to the boundary, Cole fell to the last ball of the first over from Dom Proudfoot. Aksah Singh was comfortably run put by Harry Harper going for a rather optimistic single. Nathan May replaced Proudfoot and picked up the wicket of the big hitting Farhan, trapped leg-before. With Joban Singh (7) and Ajmal Ali (6) both falling to catches by Nathan May off the bowling of young off-spinner Ollie Williams, Hurley were in

danger of subsiding to a low total, despite Mandeep going well at the other end, albeit giving a few chances. The calming influence of Mike Walton (12*) rubbed off on Mandeep as the pair looked to get the score up to 200, which they did, adding 71 in 8 overs. With Mandeep nearing his century in the last over, the batsmen went for a two to get Mandeep back on strike, but a brilliant throw to the striker's end by Williams saw Mandeep left five runs short of what would have been a deserved ton. Only one more run was added from the final two deliveries as Hurley finished on what looked like a competitive total of 213 for 8.

The visitors' reply started with the May brothers facing Joban and Mandeep and both rode their luck in the initial overs, playing and missing on numerous occasions. With only 29 runs coming from the first eight overs, Hurley looked to be on top. However, the Hurley change bowlers were unable to find their accuracy and the batsmen profited, taking the opening partnership past 150 and putting PSR in the driving seat. With Awais Hussain having a severe case of the yips, he was replaced after one over by the veteran left-arm spinner, Nigel Haines and it was the Haines/Walton partnership that accounted for both openers. Nathan attempted a reverse sweep but could only glove the ball to the keeper and then two balls later, his brother charged down the track to give Walton an easy stumping. The same combination accounted for Dan Guest, this time a much sharper piece of work by the keeper, and Hurley sensed an opening at 174 for 3. Dom Proudfoot (23) and Harry Harper (9*) got their side within 3 runs of victory before Proudfoot attempted to hit Haines over mid-on, but only found the hands of Mandeep. Another wicket fell when Williams couldn't beat the throw to the bowler's end by Mandeep, but this did not prevent PSR getting over the line with 22 balls and five wickets to spare.
