A special day at Shepherds Lane on Sunday saw the inaugural match for the Rita Walton Memorial Cup, between the two teams she spent many years scoring for, Hurley CC and Berkshire Seniors. Berkshire Seniors won the toss and asked the hosts to bat first. Things did not start well for Hurley, losing both openers with the score on 15 with Chris Garrod and Richard Wyatt picking up one each. Hassan Gul and Phil Ridgeway, batting against many of his Berkshire teammates, steadied the ship with a partnership of 71 for the third wicket. Gul struggled to time the ball early in his innings but stuck to his task and became more fluent as the day progressed. Ridgeway (35) eventually fell to Ronnie Brock. Hamzah Zaman (0) was dismissed by the wily Fred Herbert, bringing Mike Walton to the crease. In typical fashion, Walton dropped anchor, content to let Gul do the majority of the scoring at the other end. The youngster reached his century off 83 balls and then retired. Of the remaining Hurley batsmen, only Joban Singh (18) reached double figures before his stay at the crease was cut short by a direct hit from Garrod to run him out. Hurley finished on 201 all out in the thirty-ninth over. A sumptuous tea was provided, thanks to contributions from the players and sterling work by Dave Walton in the kitchen. The Berkshire reply struggled against the swing of Maz Razaq, the Hurley groundsman, making his debut as a player for the club. Razaq, picked up the first three wickets, helped by good catches from Zaman, Steve Taylor and Ridgeway to leave the visitors struggling at 33 for 3. Jim Warren did his best to stage a recovery before retiring with cramp. Joban Singh produced a delivery that proved too good for Colin Ainger and then Hurley President Pat Hinnell, playing for Berkshire, was trapped LBW by his nephew Bert Simon. Ronnie Brock and Charles Bury tried hard to make progress but found run scoring difficult against the left arm spin of Nigel Haines (3-18), Phil Ridgeway (0-26) and Faizan Javed (1-30). With the required rate climbing rapidly the batsmen had to try and hit out with the inevitable consequence that wickets began to fall. Warren returned to try and help the cause, but eventually fell to Haines, stumped by Walton, with the score on 114 in thirty-second over. Garrod (20) and Bill Green (19*) added a brisk 29 but it was too little too late, and the innings finished on 170 for 9. After the match Mike Walton made an emotional speech, thanking everyone for their efforts and remembering not only Rita, but also Heather Wilkinson, former Berkshire scorer and wife of umpire Simon, and Mike Ridgeway, longtime scorer and supporter of Hurley cricket. The cup was presented to Hurley skipper Shoaib Kayani and a brass plaque on the Hurley scoreboard in memory of Rita and Mike Ridgeway was unveiled by the Presidents of both clubs Pat Hinnell and Ronnie Brock. Thanks to generous donations by the players, a sum of £270 was collected which will be forwarded to The Stroke Association in memory of Rita.
