The annual Hurley Past v Present match took place on Sunday at Shepherds Lane. With four of Hurley's current senior players, Pat Hinnell, Mike Walton, Phil Ridgeway and Nigel Haines appearing for the Hurley Old Boys, there were bragging rights and family honour at stake with brother against brother, father against son and uncle against nephew and great nephews.

The Past XI asked the current side to bat first in a 35 overs-a-side match. Ajmal Ali and Dave Walton opened the batting and made good progress against the opening attack of Johnny Furneaux and Jono Patrick, posting 50 for the first wicket in 11 overs. Liam Cole replaced Furneaux and got the breakthrough getting Ajmal (37) caught by Furneaux. Cole then picked up the wicket of Walton (13) stumped by his brother. This proved to be a false dawn for the Past XI as Shoaib Kayani (36) and Haider-Ali Baig (42) added 81 for the third wicket. Veteran leg-spinner Steve Taylor got much needed wickets, dismissing Kayani, caught on the boundary by Mike Taylor and Akash Singh, caught behind. Not to be outdone by his brother, Mike Taylor dismissed Baig, caught and bowled, then bowled Joban for a duck. Theo Patrick became Steve Taylor's third victim caught at mid-on by his own father. Eight wickets fell for eighteen runs as the spinners prospered. Phil Ridgeway dismissed Alex Simon (3), playing his first senior match, and Mo Basharat in consecutive deliveries leaving Gurtaj to face the hat-trick ball which he managed to keep out. A suicidal run led to the run out of Gurtaj (2). An extra batsman was allowed so the youngest of the Simon brothers, Tom, could take part. He managed an unbeaten partnership of 23 with his dad Bert (9), outscoring the old man with 13 runs to his name.

After a well-received tea, the Past XI set about the chase. Openers Pat Hinnell (10) and Josh Cole (40) posted 55 for the first wicket in fourteen overs but the introduction of Ajmal Ali (4-13) turned the game as four wickets fell for 16 runs. The past had put their faith in a middle order of Naeem Akhtar, Phil Ridgeway, Mike Walton, Mike Taylor and John Furneaux, but of these, only Walton managed double figures as Joban Singh (3-15) and Haider-Ali Baig (2-18) put the stranglehold on the innings which petered out to a total of 133.
